- ❖ Continue working with sponsors to build partnerships with agencies and organizations that share the same goals and objectives. Partnerships equal strength.
- ❖ Keep members informed of Congressional activities that could affect project sponsors through the NWC website, FaceBook page, and direct mail.
- ❖ Continue to publish information materials about watershed dam rehabilitation. NWC is assisting NRCS in updating the national watershed rehabilitation status report to highlight the accomplishments and needs for rehabilitation of aging watershed dams.
- ❖ Continue to keep USDA-NRCS informed and educated concerning the technical assistance and program support needs of watershed project sponsors.
- ❖ Assist NRCS with watershed program manager training to improve watershed technical assistance delivery and customer service to watershed project sponsors.
- ❖ Build leadership capacity and volunteer opportunities for watershed project sponsors through NWC sponsored activities.
- ❖ Continue to provide individual direct assistance to state watershed coalitions as well as state and local governments.
- ❖ Continue outreach, guidance and consultation with watershed program partners.
- ❖ Work with our partners to find more ways to address operation and maintenance concerns across the nation.
- ❖ Continue to work with national leaders for approval of new projects, funding for existing projects and funding for rehabilitation of aging dams.
